She was the daughter of Earl L. Green and Edna Luke Green. She was valedictorian of her high school in Philadelphia and obtained a certificate in business school in Jackson after graduation.

She served the Lord in her communities and churches wherever she lived. She always said that as soon as you move into a new area, you find a church and begin to work there. She taught young children in Sunday School and led girls in GA's. Serving the Lord alongside her husband, Jack, was one of her greatest joys.
