Ms. Nora Conroy Hare, 86, passed away Saturday, March 28, 2026. She was born in Clonaslee, County Laois, Ireland on September 13, 1939.

After marrying a United States Airman in England, she migrated to the US in 1962 and was naturalized in 1968. She resided in Plattsburg, Mississippi for the majority of her life. She was Catholic by birth, Baptist by heart.

Her greatest joy in life was being Nanny to all of her grandchildren and great grandchildren. If she wasn't inside knitting and watching her soaps, she was outside tending to her flower beds, drinking her boxed wine, and listening to her actual true love, Conway Twitty.

She was a cosmetologist and CNA, although she held many jobs throughout her life and made so many friends along the way. She was selfless, witty, stubborn, and above all, fearless. She was proud of her Irish roots, as proud as she was to be an American, and she loved her Jesus.

She is preceded in death by her husband, Julius Lavon Hare; parents, William and Mary Stanley Conroy; brothers, William, Paddy, Ned, Matt, and Bernie Conroy; sisters, Una Conroy, Bridgette Hill; sisters and brothers-in-law, Harold Hare, Dorothy and Leroy Rogers, Patsy Thrash.

Survivors include her daughter, Shana Lenore Swindle; grandchildren, Thomas Jai Swindle, Una Elizabeth Christine McCollum (Zackary), Teela Riann Woodson (Gregory); great-grandchildren, Lexi, Bentley, Asher, Jaxton McCollum; brothers, Tom, Billy, Tim, Jim Conroy; sisters, Eileen McFadden, May Rothenburg; son-in-law, Thomas Swindle; sister-in-law, Barbara Hare; dear friend, Elmer Burnett; beloved dog, Draco and a multitude of nieces and nephews.

“ Hello Everyone - I'm Myron, Nora's nephew on the Conroy side. My Mother has been known as May her whole life to everyone from Ireland, and was the closest sibling in age to Nora. They grew up together in the 'Cush' (aka - family farm just outside of Clonaslee, on the Tulamore road just north of town). They grew up in a family of 15 children...what a difficult time it must've been for them in the 30s and 40s during WWII, and beyond. When Nora was very young she got sick and ended up with a heart murmur, now known as a leaky mitral valve. But when all the kids would go to school, she'd have to stay home half the time because she'd get sick real easy from the rain and cold. She use to say to my mom May, as she got older, "jeez May, when all of you were going to school to get educated, I'd be at home getting medicated." They would get in all kinds of trouble together, and all these years later when they'd get together and share stories with us, they would laugh until they cried about their memories.

I wanted to say something that has been stuck in my mind, and my heart all these year. I've never once seen Nora get angry. She was the perfect example of someone who could give 'Unconditional Love', like Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians chapter 13 4-7 and the first part of 8: "Love is patient and kind; love is not jealous or boastful; it is not arrogant or rude. Love does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrong, but rejoices in the right. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends..."

This passage is normally associated with a reading during a marriage, but Nora was married to life, and always showed the love she had in her heart to everyone she ever met..

She was always smiling and laughing. She liked her wine, that is for sure, but as much as she would drink I don't believe I ever saw her drunk. No doubt there were hollow legs on that woman. She was visiting Las Vegas recently before she started getting sick, and while taking in the sun, like she always liked to do, was having a glass of wine on my brother's back patio, and noticed the

hummingbird feeder was without any juice in it. Well she took it down and filled half of it up with some of her wine...wouldn't you know it, hummingbirds started coming around like locusts, and sipping out of it. She claims they went crazy over the wine and were flying around all drunk. Now most would say, awe that is BS, but if you had known Nora and the way she was all her life, that was no tall tale. I have no doubt there were hummingbirds near my brother's house waking up with a bad hangover the next day.

We'll all miss her so much, especially my mother May, and of course the family she had and mothered in Mississippi. Even though none of us make it out of this world alive...we will carry on the memories and love in the quiet of our hearts for Nora as long as any of us live, which in more ways than not keeps her alive forever. Thank you Aunt Nora for being in our life, and for the many wonderful, funny memories we'll always have.
