Robert Huck Graham was born on Valentine's Day in 1947. He enjoyed summers in Philadelphia with his grandparents, Grover and Viola Poole, throughout his childhood. At the age of 16, he met his future wife, Linda Barnett. The two were married in 1965.

Huck was a Rhodes Scholar finalist and a Taylor Medal winner at the University of Mississippi, where he graduated Summa Cum Laude in 1977. He was an avid historian and supporter of education and the arts. Huck researched and documented the histories of Newton County, Union County, Neshoba County, and Scott County.

His wife of 54 years survives him, along with his daughter, Lee Graham, his son, Bobby Graham, and his grandchildren, Kate Hodges, Kai Hodges, Sara Lacey Graham, Huck Graham, Luke Graham, and Gavin Phillips, sister, Lynn Willingham.
